Journal of Pediatric Infectious Disease is an open access journal, double blinded peer review process has been followed in our journal. In peer review process, reviewer would take 7-14 days to submit their valuable comments. It would take 21-25 days to complete the whole process, articles were published from authors all around the world. Pediatric Infectious disease: Open access is one of the leading international journal in the world. Journal is providing a vast platform to the authors to reach the journal easily through the social media by advertising the published article on the online platform such as Twitter, LinkedIn, and Academia. Average publication lag time of an article was further reduced to 2-3 weeks.

During the calendar year 2019, a total of 5 Editors, 15-20 Reviewers joined the board of PIDOA and contributed their invaluable services towards contribution as well as publication of articles.
